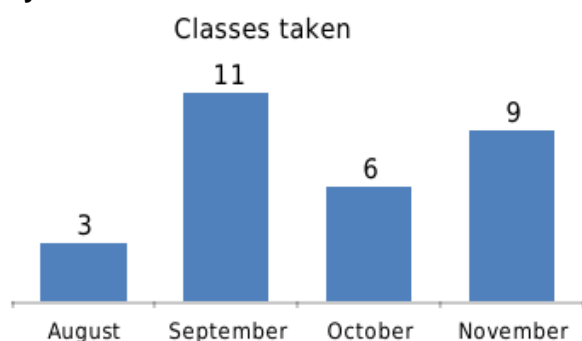

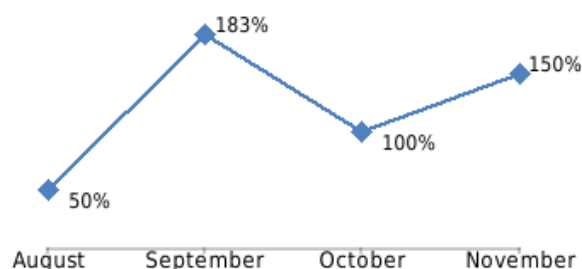

Comments on language progression and skills:

Masashi Kubota made good progress in confidence in speaking and listening and comprehension, conversational skills, vocabulary building / more sophisticated vocabulary / more extensive vocabulary, establishing greater grammatical control / improving grammatical accuracy / better use and understanding of grammar, pronunciation, word stressing and intonation, business skills, using a wider range of business expressions while practising business skills

Comments on student's attitude regarding learning:

Throughout the course Masashi Kubota made positive efforts to integrate the target language and concepts into the conversation. Regarding the course homework Masashi Kubota no real homework was assigned for this course. Interaction and participation has been excellent attitude to learning. The student fully participated in the lessons and was very keen to increase every aspect of learning. Overall Masashi Kubota always showed a positive attitude towards learning, this has been the case throughout the course

Recommendations and next steps:

Some areas that still need improvement are fluency, pronunciation and intonation, grammatical accuracy, vocabulary building. I would therefore recommend that Masashi Kubota continues to take lessons, once or twice per week, in order to maintain the level of self confidence and ensure continuous improvement. I also suggest that Masashi Kubota continues being exposed to (language) outside the class as much as possible
