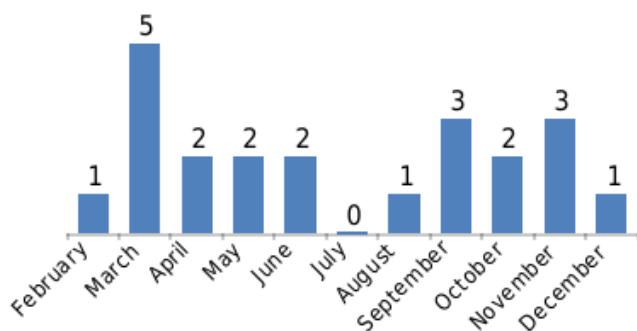

Performance rating student's effort:

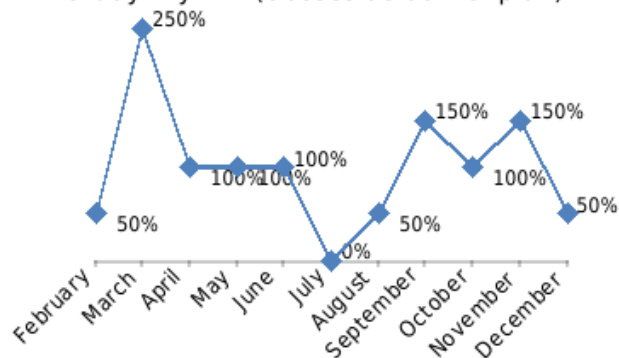

Comments on language progression and skills:

The focus of this course has been to expand his vocabulary range which has helped him to express himself better. He has to continue to expand his vocabulary in order to become more fluent.'

Comments on student's attitude regarding learning:
