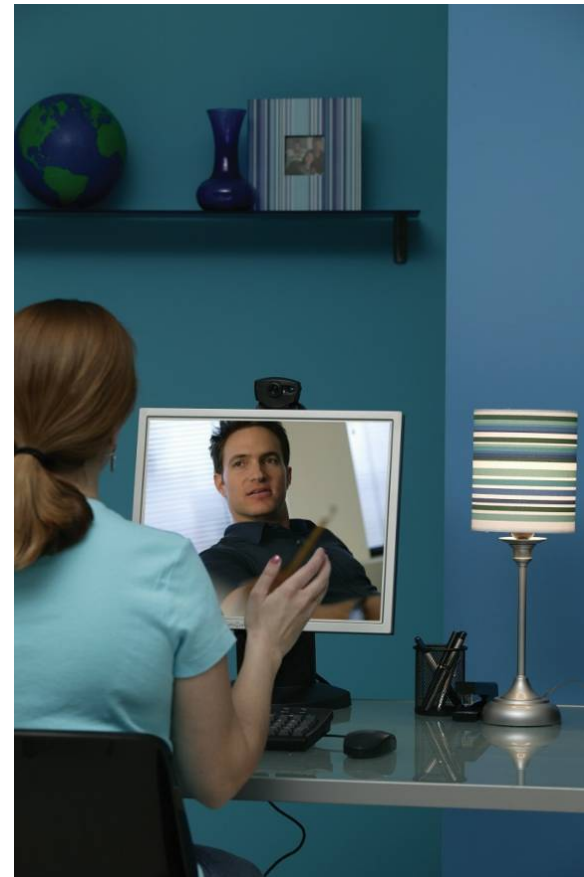


## The impact of IT on the way we work

instructions for a computer that are stored in a memory unit rather than in software

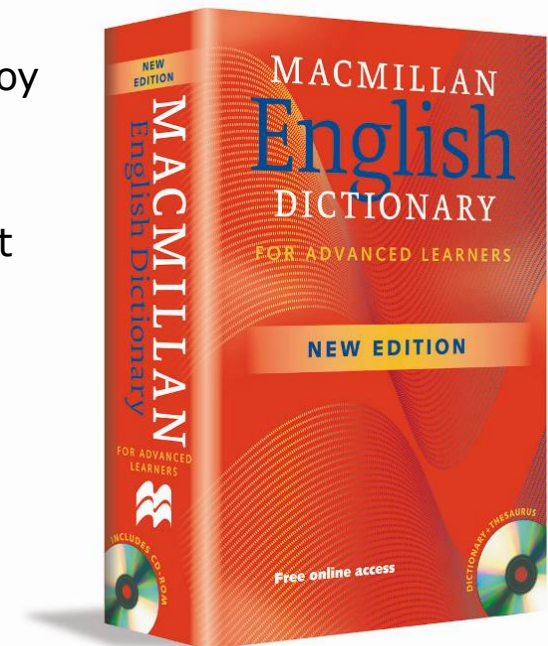
## **malware**

## **Telephone conference call tips**
